Finding Us

Excel Education is easily accessed, being located in the south of London. Due to high levels of congestion within the city, it is advisable to use public transport to travel to and from Excel Education.

British Rail, overground rail services and bus services are both available, and are within 3 minutes' walk of Excel Education. East Croydon Train and overground stations are just 2 minutes' walk. Bus stops can be found along Wellesley Road & George Street, Croydon.

• Excel Education Rules

- ♣ All visitors to the school premises must be approved by a member of staff and must sign in and out at the reception.
- Whilst on the school premises student's time should be devoted to the purposes of learning and activities which promote learning.
- 4 All incidents, however minor, that occur on the school premises should be reported to the First Aid Officer or Student Welfare Officer.

- Telephone calls for students will be accepted only in emergencies.


2. Enrolment and Registration

All students must register at the Excel Education with a valid ID (passport or ID) and 1 passport-sized photo (one for the student's file and student ID). An application form must be completed. Students cannot register without any of the above.

One week before the course starts, students should pay the tuition fee in order to be enrolled for the course or arrange the installment plan. As soon as all fees are paid the students can request letters by filling the "Request for Single letters Form" at the reception. The letters are ready for collection next week or earlier.

3. The Attendance & Progress Policy

Excel Education operates a strict attendance policy. Students are responsible for making sure that their attendance and punctuality is maintained at the highest level. Regular and punctual attendance of student at the school is expected and is strictly enforced. It is essential in order for students to maximize their learning. You will be required to attend classes regularly. The course regulations say that you must attend 80% of classes to complete each course, however we expect you to attend all of the sessions and you must let your tutor know and also the Director of studies if you have any days which you need to take off in advance so that, We can prepare you accordingly.



Lateness

Students are expected to arrive on time, however if they arrive within the first 15 minutes they will be marked in late any time after will result in unauthorised absence. No student will enter after the first 30 minutes and will be permitted to enter at the next scheduled break time (this is at the discretion of the tutor).

All students are expected to be punctual. Late arrival to school means a disorganised start to the day and disrupts lessons. Apart from being discourteous and inconvenient, lateness means that students miss important information from their class. So please be on time!

4. The procedure for notification of absence

Every student must report any absence to Excel Education as soon as possible and following their return to college provide evidence/a valid reason for the absence.

In case of illness, the school should be notified by telephone or by e-mail info@excel.center as soon as possible and the student must bring a written explanation of his/her absence to the Director of Studies on his/her return. If an absence is not confirmed it is assumed that the absence was unauthorised, and it is recorded as such.

Any leave of absence must be requested using the appropriate form from reception <u>and</u> must be approved by the member of senior admin staff.

5. Registration for External Examinations

The Excel Education is happy to assist students in registering for external examinations such as Gatehouse Awards & Trinity College etc. However, the exam fees for all such examinations are the student's responsibility and are not included in the price of any course. Students should ensure that they register in good time for the exam.

6. Health & Safety

Both students and visitors must:

- ✓ Work safely and effectively, and with due regard to the effects and impact of any action on others. In particular, no action (or inaction) should cause harm to another person or persons.
- ✓ Comply with all statutory regulations, Excel Education rules and standard operating procedures.
- ✓ Use and maintain all equipment and facilities provided in the correct manner, and immediately report any unsafe conditions or defects found.
- ✓ Report all accidents as instructed in the accident reporting procedure.
- ✓ Have an approach of awareness, involvement, and commitment to excellence in health and safety.

Fire Procedures

9. Student ID/ Letters

Each student will be issued with a Student ID Card on demand. You must keep your Student ID Card with you at all times. It will contain both the contact details of Excel Education and other important telephone numbers. Once you have completed your course you will be awarded with a Certificate of Completion if you have attended 80% or more of the course.

As soon as all fees are paid the students can request letters by filling the "Request for Single letters Form" at the reception. The letters are ready for collection next week or earlier.

10. Careers Advice

Out staff will be able to provide you with information about careers or future courses which may interest you. Throughout your studies (period as a student with us) your tutor will keep a record of your progress. At the end of your course your tutor will complete a reference, if you request one (which you may see). If you wish to use the school as a referee when applying for a job, please address your application form to the Director of Studies.

10. Student Finance and Fees Payment

Excel Education can provide students with a letter from college to open their own bank account in order to manage their own finances.

Please make sure that you have paid your fees in full before starting the course and if you still have some amount outstanding, please contact Financial Officer for Instalment plans. ACCORDING TO EXCEL EDUCATION REGULATIONS, STUDENTS ARE NOT ISSUED ANY LETTERS UNTILL THEY PAY THEIR COURSE FEES IN FULL.

11. STUDENT WELFARE

Excel Education has two welfare officers (female and male: Mrs Tavga Hussain, Mr Saad Akhtar) available for students to discuss any problems or issues they may be experiencing. This can be related to anything to do with the course to personal problems outside the school. We understand that sometimes just by speaking to someone can help you feel better. If we feel the problem is too serious for us to deal with at the school we will not turn you away but point you in the right direction.

13. WHAT WE CAN HELP WITH:

COUNCIL TAX

Council Tax is a tax set by councils to help pay for local services like policing and refuse collection. It applies to all domestic properties.

The Reception can provide you with Council Tax Exemption letter for full-time students on request. You can come to the reception to see if you may qualify for exemption so please consider the following points:

- Full-time students living in other accommodation occupied solely by full-time students will be granted exemption from payment of the Council Tax on submission to the council of a Council Tax Exemption Certificate for each individual.
- ❖ Where only one adult who is not a full-time student and lives in a dwelling together with one or more full-time students, a reduction of 25 percent in the Council Tax for the dwelling will be given on submission of a Council Tax Exemption letter for each student. This covers the case, for example, of a student or students living at home with only one person, or a student living with a non-student husband or wife.

- ❖ Part-time students are not entitled to any exemption from or reduction of the Council Tax, although they can apply directly to their local authority for a rebate if they are on a low income.
- Where a full-time student or students live(s) together with two or more non-student adults (for example, at home with both parents) no reduction will be given for the dwelling. There is therefore no benefit in requesting an Exemption letter if these are your circumstances.

STUDENT TRAVEL

Students are entitled to discounted travel on rail services by using a **Student RAIL Card.** You can obtain a student application form at any rail station and bring to the reception to get it stamped.

14. Local Services Provided By Other Organizations

Community support services

19. Top 10 Things To Do In London

1. Best Museum or gallery

<u>Cuming Museum</u>, Walworth Road

The small but perfectly formed Cuming Museum is a world of weirdness on the Walworth road, the Lovett collection being of special interest. Edward Lovett spent every spare moment collecting lucky charms from the backstreets of the East End. He published his findings in the book **Magic in Modern London** and the Cuming is the best place to see some of his items. While you're there, check out the amazing workshops and events that would bring a proud blush to the cheek of any world-class mega-museum.

The South London Gallery, Peckham Road

This Victorian building in Peckham Road is one of Southwark's greatest assets. Not only does it house an impressive permanent art collection, it also hosts a range of exciting FREE exhibitions. The newish and rather <u>excellent cafe</u> next to the SLG is an added incentive to visit.

2. Best Local Attraction

Elephant and Castle Shopping Centre

I've always thought that the majestic concrete wilderness of the Aylesbury Estate would provide an amazing venue for live performance. However, I have never managed to sort this out so I suppose I better settle for the empty space in the Elephant and Castle shopping centre. This has played host to a number of art projects over the past year including performances by The Royal Court. Elephant and Castle shopping centre is also of interest to students of retail design because it retains many original '70s and '80s shops.

Nunhead Cemetery

Want to get back to nature? For beauty, serenity, history and atmosphere you can't beat Nunhead Cemetery, which is probably the <u>most attractive of London's Big Seven</u> Victorian burial grounds.

3. Best Pub

The Lord Clyde, Borough

The Lord Clyde is a pub-goers' pub with great beer and old-fangled vibe. No fancy music or gourmet food for the LC. Order a ham sandwich and a pink slice between two breads is what you will get.

4. Best Church

Haddon Hall Baptist Church, Tower Bridge Road

Why go to a jumped up medieval cathedral when you can savour the school-gym ambience of friendly Haddon Hall Baptist Church? With extensive provision for children and fantastic biscuits, I'd go to Haddon Hall any day if I believed in God. If you must have your literary history, St George on Borough High Street has a stained glass window depicting Dickens' Little Dorrit.

5. Best Visitor Attraction

Surrey Docks City Farm

Surrey Docks City Farm has goats. The pigs are twice as big as a man and have been known to escape. Miss Libby Rose makes burlesque wiggle-skirts in their shed.

6. Best Not-So-Secret 'Secret' Southwark

Crossbones Graveyard, Redcross Way.

This is an unconsecrated burial ground dating back to the 12th Century when the land-owning Bishop of Winchester granted prostitutes in the borough legal permission to practice their trade. Needless to say they were not free to be buried on church ground and their bodies were buried in Crossbones. Centuries went by and the burial ground became a resting place for witches and workhouse brats. It closed in the early 19th Century because it was "Overcharged with the dead". In the 1870s Lord Brabizon successfully vetoed plans to develop on the site. From the 1990s to the present local poet and shaman John Constable (AKA John Crow) has led a campaign to raise awareness of the importance of this site. And now it is up for sale again. 15,000 people are buried here and I can't help thinking that they should maybe get the respect in death that they didn't get in life. The gates have become an impromptu shrine decorated with ribbons and trinkets. Vigils are held at 7pm on the 23rd of each month.

<u>Frank's Café and Campari Bar</u>, top of the multistory car park, Moncrieff Street, Peckham are such a well kept secret any more, as hordes climb to the top in the summer months in search of <u>Campari and sculpture</u>. But even when this Peckham rooftop is not thronging with young trendy things, it is worth a visit as the cityscape views are some of the best in London.


